## Welcoming remarks written for: Lisa Oliver, President, Greater Cleveland District KeyBank Supplier Diversity Summit

I'm also proud to say that five of those 10 entrepreneurs who were honored this week are KeyBank clients. And that certainly underscores the value we place on relationships here at Key. And in that spirit, there's another important value we hold dearly, and that's our value for diversity.

Last month, *DiversityInc* ranked Key on its list of the Top 50 Companies for Diversity and a top 10 company for supplier diversity. In just a few short years, we've moved our procurement-based spending with Minority and Women-owned suppliers from the low single digits to 11.6 percent in 2006, with a goal of 15 percent by 2010.

Our CEO Henry Meyer has engrained in all of us that diversity is about opportunities to be stronger, because involving people with diverse backgrounds and ideas *always* produces better decisions.

Today we're joining the pursuit of superior business performance with our strong desire to afford you the opportunity to compete for a very significant amount of business. This is the way we intend to manage major program investments in our franchise.
